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#### Water Safety Talks

Each year Lifeguards deliver the City of Newcastle's unique Water Safety Education Program to over 13,000 primary school children across the Newcastle local government area.

Lifeguards attended our school on Friday 29th July to deliver key messages about safety and drowning prevention. The program seeks to interactively educate children about water safety and covers water safety at the beach, at the pool and around open bodies of water such as rivers, lakes and dams.

By actively engaging children and empowering them with the knowledge to keep them safe, we hope to prevent child drownings, accidents and minimise children getting into dangerous situations. Both beach and pool lifeguards present the program at local schools during winter, in an attempt to ensure the safety of their patrons leading into the City's popular spring and summer swimming seasons.

Our staff and students thoroughly enjoyed the presentation and learnt a lot!



#### **Tell Them From Me Survey**

This Term, our school will be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey, another part of the Tell Them From Me suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

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The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted over Term 3 and early Term 4. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

# Days missed = years lost

A day here and there doesn't seem like much, but...

When your child misses ju	ust	they miss weeks per year		and years over their school life
day per fortnight	=	4 weeks	=	Over year missed
day per week	=	8 weeks	=	over <b>2.5</b> years missed

#### The importance of arriving on time to school

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

#### What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include: being sick, or having an infectious disease, having an unavoidable medical appointment, being required to attend a recognised religious holiday, exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

#### My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the classroom teacher as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The Principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

✓ Covid is heavily affecting our teachers with many away. There has also been an impact on the casual staff available ⊖


